

Board meeting summary

Construction projects continue to progress, the board project to install a grinder is nearly completed, roofing work has significant progress, and paving company is prepping the parking areas to begin laying asphalt.

Resignations were accepted from Tosha Arnold, special education teacher, and Casey Henderson, assistant superintendent.

Board policy updates were approved. Changes reflected items from legislature to ensure policy reflects current law. The board utilizes the KSBA Policy Service to maintain current policy.

The revision of BG 08-095 is simply to close out the athletic complex project with the Department of Education; that the available funds have been spent to improve the complex.

Purchase Area Health Department contract is to provide the school nurse at the elementary school. The creation of special education aides will be paid with stimulus funds for this year. The legislature approved using capital outlay funds for general fund purposes this year only with the Commissioner of Education approval to help alleviate budget shortfalls. This request is to use available capital outlay to help pay various insurance premiums.

Changes orders were approved for the paving and roofing projects. The focus is to improve control of water run-off and roof the life skills house. Approval was given for students to attend the yearbook camp at John A. Logan College at the end of July.
