

Carlisle County School District ESSER/ARP Plan

Summary of Plan's Construction (Meaningful Consultation)

An ESSER/ARP survey was developed and sent out to all stakeholders. A public forum was held before July meeting. Stakeholders included parents, students, faculty, staff, and community members. Consultation of fund usage also occurred during each school's SBDM meeting. The feedback was collected and shared among Administration, both board, district and school level. A consensus was reached and the plan was made and modified. The board and the district office will continue to seek feedback in spending the ESSER/ARP funding.

<p>We recognize at Carlisle County schools that reopening schools safely and in person is key to giving the students the instruction they need as well as to make up for lost instruction over the past two years. In order to open safely, we are going to put the following protocols in place to ensure as much in person learning as possible.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. When possible, schools will increase space between students by rearranging seating to maximize space between students to be three feet or greater. 2. If the physical space in each classroom does not allow for spacing students' desks three feet apart, desks/tables will be spaced as far away as possible. Masks are recommended. 3. Schools will stagger arrival and dismissal times. 4. Congestion will be reduced in common areas (school office, nurse's guidance office, etc) 5. Seating charts will be in place. Signage will also be posted to social distance. Teachers will be advised to space students out when possible 2. Signage will be posted encouraging students to wear masks if they are not vaccinated, and cannot social distance. 3. Dismiss students in groups 4. Students and staff will be trained, and signs will be posted. 5. District will provide sanitizer, and students will have access to washing their hands any time it is needed. Signage will be used to show proper technique
